Southern Highlands Community Hospice Palliative Care Scholarships 2025

Southern Highland Community Hospice is offering scholarships in palliative care post graduate education for two local nurses.

The scholarships are for graduate nurses considering post graduate study in **palliative care** to study at **University of Technology Sydney** or **Flinders University** and will cover all course fees, and in some cases, study leave support may be provided (depending on employer).

University requirements: - Completed Australian bachelor's degree or higher qualification, or overseas equivalent AND Current registration with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (APHRA) as a health professional in Australia AND Concurrent employment in or access to the clinical area of study AND A minimum of 1 year full-time, or equivalent parttime, post registration clinical experience

OR

A minimum of 1 year full-time, or equivalent part-time, relevant professional experience AND A general capacity to undertake tertiary education, demonstrated by successful completion of hospital or college certificates and professional or staff development

Applicants' current nursing registration is confirmed via the National Register of Practitioners.

Course withdrawal or amendment

Successful applicants who withdraw from their course of study or who do not pass course requirements must notify the board of the SHCH. Full or partial repayment of scholarship funding may be required after review of individual circumstances- See below



- Paid support will be on a subject-by-subject basis and is conditional upon your successful completion of each module.
- You will be required to attend regular check-ins with an allocated study support coordinator.
- You may be required to educate your colleagues on topics learnt during your study, as requested by your study support coordinator.
- The ongoing scholarship support will be made on the basis that you will pass all subjects attempted. If you do not successfully complete the qualification, you may be required to repay the cost of the course to Southern Highlands Community Hospice.
- As part of our commitment to your learning and development, a further condition of the scholarship agreement is that you will remain in the employment of a SHCH approved palliative care provider in the Southern Highlands, NSW area for 24 months after you complete your qualification. Details on request.

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Please provide the following information in your application: -

- Current Curriculum Vitae including qualifications and professional experience,
- 2. A one-page letter addressed to *The Secretary of Southern Highlands*Community Hospice, detailing your interest in further study, and how this scholarship opportunity will support you to achieve your career goals.
- 3. Willingness to work in a Southern Highlands Community Hospice setting (part-time or full-time).

EOIs will be reviewed by the SHCH panel and form the basis for interviews. The successful applicants will be notified in time for the enrolment in the University of choice for a semester one start.
