Another successful year of supporting palliative care volunteering across **NSW**

As always, the Volunteer Support Services
Programme (VSSP) had a busy year
supporting volunteers, volunteer managers,
and volunteer services. We continue to host
the NSW Network of Managers of Palliative
Care Volunteers running quarterly meetings.

Our **VolunteerHub** website continues to be the repository for all things volunteering. We had over 15,000 page visits and the numbers of subscribers to our monthly eNews bulletins has increased by 17%. We added a new video, "VSSP Program Information" to our suite of resources. This video came out of our online information session for clinicians on 12 October.

We were excited in March when James
MacDonald, student intern from Macquarie
University joined us ready to engage in
research. James worked with us for three
months gathering data towards our "Tracking
the post-COVID recovery of palliative care
volunteer services in NSW" research report.
To be released in FY25.

2023 Volunteer Conference

'The Power of Perspective' 23 – 24 Oct

Palliative Care

We were very excited to host yet another successful conference for palliative care volunteers drawing in **143 delegates from all over NSW**. Held at the RSL Lifecare ANZAC Village in Narrabeen, the conference brought delegates together giving them the opportunity to connect with their peers, hear from leaders in their field, and participate in immersive experiences.

The first day offered **four concurrent sessions** including Boundaries for Wellness, How to write a truthful and engaging biography, Understanding Dementia, and Grief & Loss – a Volunteer Perspective.

The opening plenary was delivered by **Teresa Plane, NSW Senior Australian of the Year 2023** and a pioneer of palliative care in Australia. Teresa shared insights from her decades of working with the dying in a beautiful and compassionate way. Her reflections on how those dying can be educators for how to live well was incredibly compelling. After 30 minutes, Teresa had gained celebrity status with many people queuing to meet her, express their gratitude and take a photo or two to remember the time they got to meet this extraordinary Australian.

Other sessions covered Voluntary Assisted Dying, Defeating Stress, and the popular interactive break-out experiences – the Tech Space, the Art Space, the Music Space, and Sensory Space. Delegates experienced a variety of practical ways to connect with their clients including hand massages, drawing and visualisation, the Reverie Harp, and the use of virtual reality.

PCNSW with funding support from the NSW Ministry of Health were pleased to offer scholarships to rural and regional volunteers to assist them with the costs of attending the conference. Delegates represented **27 palliative care volunteer services from across 12 LHD's**, **2 statewide networks**, and **1 PHN**.
